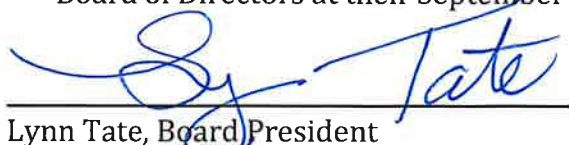




HIGH PLAINS UNDERGROUND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT NO. 1 RESOLUTION SETTING 2026 TAX RATE

- 1) The Board of Directors of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District ("HPWD") hereby adopts, levies, or sets a tax for the year of 2026 at the rate of **\$0.002976** upon each \$100 of assessed valuation of property on the tax rolls of each county or portion of county within the District as of January 1, 2026.
- 2) HPWD includes all of Bailey, Cochran, Hale, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Parmer, and Swisher Counties as well as portions of Armstrong, Castro, Crosby, Deaf Smith, Floyd, Hockley, Potter, and Randall Counties.
- 3) This tax levy is to provide funds for the operation of HPWD and payment of its obligations. It does not exceed last year's maintenance and operations tax levy. The ordinance, resolution, or order setting this year's tax rate does not require the statements about "tax increase," as specified in Section 26.05(b) of the Property Tax Code.
- 4) This year's tax rate does not exceed the no-new-revenue tax rate. A motion to adopt an ordinance, resolution, or order setting the tax rate does not require the language about "tax increase," as stated in 26.05(b) of the Property Tax Code.
- 5) HPWD designates the Tax Assessor-Collector or County Tax Appraisal District in each county or portion of county within the District as assessor and/or collector of HPWD taxes. This designation pertains to property in the respective counties and all delinquent taxes, which may be collected.
- 6) HPWD hereby adopts the assessment rolls of all counties within the District for the year 2026 as its own.
- 7) HPWD will pay an appropriate fee to each respective tax collector for all said taxes assessed against all property within those counties that are included in the HPWD adopted assessment rolls.
- 8) Homestead exemptions, relating to HPWD, shall be granted or withheld in the same manner as those adopted or withheld by the respective County Tax Assessor-Collector or County Tax Appraisal Districts within the HPWD service area.
- 9) This resolution was adopted by vote of the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District Board of Directors at their September 8, 2026 regular meeting.
